



# WHAT IS A LOCAL WATERFRONT REVITALIZATION PROGRAM (LWRP)?

An LWRP is a local comprehensive land and water use plan for a community's coastal area which incorporates a Harbor Management Plan (HMP).

The New York State (NYS) Coastal Management Program authorizes the development of LWRPs.

LWRPs utilize input from the public to create a shared vision for the waterfront area.

The Village LWRP policies provide a balance between natural resource protection and economic development for the waterfront.

Sag Harbor's original LWRP was adopted in 1986 and the Village first adopted a HMP in 1999 - both were last updated in 2006.

Projects within the coastal area must be consistent with LWRP policies to promote the most beneficial use of coastal resources and prevent impairment of such resources.





# WHAT WILL THE SAG HARBOR LWRP UPDATE INCLUDE?

**Similar to the 1986 and 2006 LWRPs, this LWRP Update will include:**

- Inventory and analysis of existing conditions
- Issues and opportunities for revitalization and planning for the future
- Proposed land uses, water uses and projects
- Implementation techniques and potential funding programs
